The College will organize a program of classroom instruction including introductory courses in Chinese culture, language, martial arts, etc. Students will be hosted by a Chinese family for two nights in Beijing. There will also be an opportunity to visit major attractions.

At the same time, Chinese students will take part in an English language program. Activities will be scheduled so that New Brunswick and Chinese students can work together to reinforce skills in both languages.

Application Process

- A short essay (submitted with application)
- Two references (submitted with application
- Deadline for application: December 7, 2018
- If selected, a \$500 deposit MUST be received by January 31, 2019 (\$250 non-refundable)
- Applications must currently be in Gr 10 or 11 (students in Grade 12 will be considered after eligible students have been selected)

Students ARE EXPECTED to complete an essay detailing their experience upon their return. A \$500 prize will be awarded to the top essay by the end of the summer.

Late applicants will only be considered if space permits.



China Summer Cultural Program

China Program Details:

- > Students will be accommodated at the student dormitories located on campus.
- > 2-4 New Brunswick and Chinese students per room.
- > Washroom and shower facilitates on each floor or wing of the dormitory.
- > Female and male accommodations are separated.
- Each dormitory is chaperoned by a Chinese teacher/worker. The students must follow the dormitory rules. NB chaperones will be close by.
- Meals are provided. These are typical cafeteria-style Chinese food with some opportunity to experience meals in a traditional Chinese restaurant.
- > All in country transportation is provided.
- During the first weekend in Beijing, the New Brunswick students will be hosted by a Chinese family in their home.

Orientation prior to departure:

There will be an orientation session held on a Saturday in May. This is an opportunity for all the students and their families to attend. Participation is strongly encouraged as important information will be shared during the presentation and question and answer portion of the day. It will also give the students the opportunity to meet the other participants as well as the NB chaperones.
