## 5 Dramalic Purposes for Act 1 Scene 1

- 1. Street fight captures the audience's attention and shows the seriousness of the feud.
- 2. All the leading characters are introduced except Juliet and Mercutio.
  - 3. The selling is introduced Verona.
  - 4. The basic conflict is revealed in the romance that is threatened by a family feud Romea's distance from his family members because of his feelings for a young girl (nameless at this point).
- 5. Benrolia's prophecy of his death (last line in scene) prepares the audience for the further tragic developments.

## <u>Prologue – page 9</u> <u>Smportant features:</u>

- 1. Performed by the Charus.
- 2. Written in Shakespearean Sonnet format:
  - 14 lines
  - First 12 lines follow ABAB rhyme scheme every first and third line rhyme with each other and every second and fourth line rhyme with each other.
- 3. Last 2 lines are called a <u>couplet</u> as they are two rhyming lines in a poem. They follow an **AA** rhyme scheme.
