

What is Farm to School Month?

Each October, Farm to Cafeteria Canada collaborates with lead agencies and a growing network of schools from across the country to organize and deliver the annual Farm to School Month CANADA celebrations.

Farm to School Month is designed to engage and connect pre-school, school-age (K-12) and campus communities to showcase the numerous and diverse farm and local food to school initiatives happening across the country, while inspiring others to join the movement.

Farm to Cafeteria Canada has established the 2019 Farm to School Month's theme as "Healthy People, Healthy Planet" and aims to engage and empower Canada's children and youth to learn about actions they can take to promote the health of both people and planet.
