Talk Mail

Once again this year we will be making school announcements using "talk mail." We find "talk mail" to be the most efficient and fastest way to reach parents when we need to send home information (ie. late buses, etc). If you have not registered for TalkMail you can register *at no charge to you!* All you need to do is call toll free 1-800-561-6283 and ask to have this feature added to your phone line.

Note: If you receive a message that is of no concern to you, you can delete it before it is finished by pressing "3" to end the message, and then "7" to delete it.

Bus Transfer Requests

We need you to help us with this!

Please be advised that some days we receive up to thirty or more bus transfers. In an effort to make this happen smoothly, we are asking that you send a written request to school with your child indicating the address your child is going to, as well as the bus they need to travel on to get there. These notes will be processed by the secretary each morning. We are asking that **telephone requests** be made only in emergency cases.

We will continue to attempt to accommodate changes to a different bus for baby-sitting reasons and appointments. As was the case last year *we will not* be accommodating bus changes for birthday parties or social gatherings. We are not obligated to entertain these requests.

Keep in mind that because of the number of students traveling to and from school on our school busses, it may not always be possible to grant bus change requests. We know you will understand that we must make every possible effort to keep our busses safe for our children...meaning we must stay within our number guideline.

Thank you for your continued cooperation.

Cell Phone Policy

Many of our students have cell phones and they are permitted on school property, however strict guidelines apply. We know you will agree, students come to school to pay attention in class and do the assigned work. They cannot be distracted by receiving or sending phone calls or text messages.

Cell phones are only permitted to be used in common areas of the school....open area, cafeteria, hallway, etc. Students may use their cell phone before class, during morning break, lunchtime and after school. Cell phones are not permitted to be on in classrooms. Picture taking with cell-phones is strictly prohibited.

First offence: Student surrenders cell phone to the supervising teacher who delivers it to administration. Parent or guardian is required to come to school to get phone.

Second offence: Phone is taken to office by supervising teacher, administrator calls home, student will be suspended for one day or cell phone will be kept in the office for one week (7 days).

Third offence: Phone is taken to the office by supervising teacher, administrator calls home, student will be suspended for two days or cell phone will be kept in office for two weeks (14 days). Further offences will result in escalating consequences.

Dress Code

No:

- Headgear (caps, toques, headbands, hoods)
- Inappropriate slogan t-shirts (reference to drugs/alcohol, sexual connotations)
- Excessively short shorts/skirts (hand width above the knee)
- Revealed midriffs (No skin should be showing, tops must meet top of pants)
- Halter tops, belly tops, tube tops, muscle shirts, no strapless tops
- Revealed undergarments, revealing tops
- Shoulder straps must be wide enough so as not to display bra straps

Blackville Students and Staff are participating in the Terry Fox Walk. We are inviting you to come and walk with us and show that we support such an important cause.

This is the 30th anniversary of the Terry Fox Run for Cancer Research. Terry began his "Marathon of Hope" on April 12th, 1980, by dipping his artificial leg into the Atlantic Ocean. He was forced to stop his run 143 days later in Thunder Bay, Ontario, after running 5374 km.


Your child has brought home a sneaker to cut out and decorate, and dedicate to a family member they know has been affected by cancer. Each student and family member will participate in the walk in honor of that person. Students can return these to the school as soon as they are completed and these will be displayed on the "Wall of Hope" located in the main lobby of the school.
